Membership Requirements

You must hold at least a private pilot's certificate to become a member of the 99s. Student pilots are encouraged to join as well through the "Future Women Pilots" program. All you need is a current medical certificate or equivalent document for non-US applicants. You can remain a Future Woman Pilot for up to three years or until you receive your pilot's license, when you can update your status to a "99" membership and receive all the benefits of being a full member.

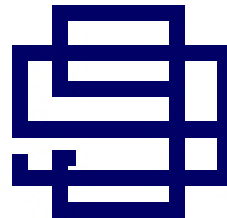

THE NINETY-NINES, INC. *is the world's largest and oldest organization of licensed women pilots, founded in 1929 for the mutual support and advancement of aviation.*

We are an international organization with over 6,000 members in 35 countries. Starting with our first president, Amelia Earhart, virtually all women of achievement in aviation have been or are members of The Ninety-Nines.

Today Ninety-Nines are professional pilots for airlines, industry and government; we are pilots who teach and pilots who fly for pleasure; we are pilots who are technicians and mechanics. But first and foremost, *we are women who love to fly!*

Reno Area 99s

The Reno Area 99s was chartered in 1964 to support women pilots flying in the Truckee Meadows and south through Carson City to Minden and Gardnerville Nevada. Our current members range from sport pilots to corporate pilots to instructors, military pilots and other aviation professionals. We have several accomplished glider pilots who take advantage of the area's spectacular soaring conditions. We have national-level competitors in both power and gliders. There are also some less active enthusiasts, who keep busy with 99s but fly less often. We also have several future women pilots who are in the process of learning to fly.

Scholarships

Each year The Reno 99s offers three scholarships:

- Two Advanced Rating awards of \$3000 each
- One Private Certificate award of \$2000

In addition the national Ninety-Nines offers numerous scholarships and grants.

Community Involvement

The Reno Area 99s meet monthly and are involved in many flying activities including:

Reno Air Races Every year we help the Air Racing Association during the races in September. Held at Stead Airport this is our most important and most fun local event. The compensation we receive helps fund scholarships.

Career Days We talk to school classes about aviation careers opportunities for women.

Girl Scout Badge Program We have been working with the local Girl Scout Council for several years presenting programs on aviation. The Aviation Patch Program has been presented to over 200 girls. The new Aviation Badge Program has been presented to about 30 girls

Air Marking Have you ever flown over an airport and wondered who painted the name and elevation on the runway? The 99s do!

Supporting Local Airports We help out at local airshows, open houses, safety seminars and other events.
